Our terms and conditions

The Community Schools offer both in-person and online tutoring services which each fall within the scope of this policy statement

We believe that :

- our students should never experience abuse of any kind
- we have a responsibility to promote the welfare of all our students, to keep them safe and to practise in a way that protects them
- each student will receive their tutoring in a safe environment, with reasonable steps taken to protect every student from harm, discrimination or demeaning treatment.
- every student is entitled to have their rights, wishes and feelings respected
- every tutor is entitled to be treated with respect

We recognise that:

- the welfare of each student is paramount (The Children Act 1989)
- working in partnership with students, their parents, carers and other agencies is essential in promoting the students' welfare
- all students, regardless of age, disability, gender reassignment, race, religion or belief, sex or sexual orientation have an equal right to protection from all types of harm or abuse
- some students are additionally vulnerable because of the impact of previous experiences, their level of dependency, communication needs or other issues

We will seek to keep our students safe by:

- valuing, listening to and respecting them
- appointing a Designated child protection lead for safeguarding
- adopting child protection and safeguarding best practice through our policies, procedures and code of conduct
- providing effective support measures and updated training for our tutors so that they know about and follow our safeguarding policies and procedures confidently and competently
- recruiting tutors safely -
  - tutors complete an application form, providing details of their academic qualifications, QTS status and their right to teach in England (these are verified)
  - $\circ$  tutors provide two professional references (these are verified)
  - $\circ$   $\;$  tutors provide proof of their identity and residential address
  - tutors must have an enhanced DBS certificate with Enhanced Barred list checks
- Ensure compliance with GDPR legislation
