Frequently Asked Questions

Is this a drop-off session?

Yes. Parents are welcome to drop off their children confidently and return at the end of the session. Please ensure they are picked up promptly.

Is there a café or waiting area?

There is a comfortable cafe with refreshments. Younger siblings can sit with you there. Students are welcome to use the cafe facilities in their break time.

Should my child bring lunch or snacks?

Please pack a light snack (e.g. fruit, cereal bars) and a refillable water bottle.

Are there any food restrictions?

Our sessions are nut-free. Please avoid packing any nut-based products.

Is there an onboarding form or portal?

Yes. All families complete a simple online onboarding form via our Parent Portal before the first session. A follow up video call will be arranged to discuss your child's individual needs before joining with a member of our Home-Ed hub team.

Can children of different ages attend together?

We are aiming the sessions to support Key stage 3 learners predominantly but our small-group model ensures age- and ability-appropriate instruction.

Frequently Asked Questions

Will there be homework?

Optional follow-up tasks will be suggested, but not compulsory—designed to reinforce learning, not overwhelm.

What supplies does my child need?

Basic stationery (pen, pencil, ruler), a notebook, and any subject-specific equipment (e.g. calculator for Maths).

Phone regulations?

We encourage students to keep phones on silent in their bags to minimise distractions.

Do you offer SEN support?

Yes. Our tutors are trained to adapt lessons for a range of additional learning needs. Please indicate any SEN requirements on the onboarding form and discuss helpful accommodations in the onboarding video call.

How can I contact my child's tutor during the week? All registered families have access to our Parent Portal, where you can securely message your tutor, notify us of any non-attendance, and arrange to rebook sessions for the next term.
